

ASSESSMENTS OPTIONS & FEES

On the next page, you can find Dr. Greenfield's current assessment options and fees for some of the more commonly requested assessments. Dr. Greenfield's assessments are all customized to answer your questions and match the needs of your child, but we have included a general overview of what is included with each.

To make our flexible, low-stress assessment approach work, our assessment prices are **flat fees**. So if your child needs a bit more time to play, feel comfortable, or finish their work, you do not have to worry about any surprise costs that come with hourly fees. A 10% deposit is required to reserve your child's testing date(s), and the remainder of the balance is due 2 business days before their first testing day.

All of our assessments include:

- A parent intake, including a comprehensive review of your child's developmental, medical, academic, and social-emotional history;
- Phone/email consultation between Dr. Greenfield and your child's teachers/providers;
- Child/teacher/parent clinical rating measures to assess for symptoms of behavioral, emotional, and social challenges across environments;
- In-person testing (hours below) over one or more days (all testing is conducted by Dr. Greenfield);
- Scoring & interpretation of test results;
- A parent feedback to review the assessment results, answer your questions, and discuss recommendations/appropriate resources for your child;
- A final report with relevant diagnoses and a treatment plan tailored to your child's unique cognitive profile;
- When requested by parents, Dr. Greenfield also offers a separate age-appropriate feedback to help your child understand their unique brain, how they can utilize their personal strengths (brain superpowers!), and answer any questions they may have.

Traditional/Comprehensive Assessments:

Psychoeducational Assessment This assessment will answer questions about ADHD, Learning Disorders, Giftedness, and other mood/behavioral challenges. (IQ, academic achievement [reading, writing, & math], language, visual-motor, and attention testing).	Approx. 5-6 hours of in- person testing over 1-3 days	\$2750
Neuropsychological Assessment This is a customized assessment that can help answer specific questions parents may have, clarify a diagnosis, and understand cognitive & socioemotional strengths and weaknesses. This is an appropriate assessment for parents that have concerns across a few, identified areas (ex: ADHD, Autism, and reading concerns) (IQ, language, visual-motor skills, and attention/executive functioning testing, as well as 1-2 other areas of specific concern).	Approx. 5-6 hours of in- person testing over 1-3 days	\$2750
Comprehensive Neuropsychological Assessment This option included all areas discussed in the psychoeducational and targeted neuropsychological assessments above, learning/memory testing, in-depth testing of other areas specific to your concerns, and any additional observed weaknesses during testing. The evaluation will consider several differential diagnoses and rule out other potential underlying cognitive issues that may be contributing to your child's observed challenges. A school observation is included with no extra charge when deemed necessary by Dr. Greenfield. With a thorough understanding of your child's cognitive strengths and weaknesses, Dr. Greenfield will be able to individualize your child's treatment plan to leverage their cognitive strengths and connect you with the best recourses for their unique neurocognitive profile, leading to faster and more meaningful progress. This testing may be relevant in situations such as: • Independent Educational Evaluations (IEEs) through the school district • Differential diagnosis of multiple or complex issues • When families want a more comprehensive understanding of their child's cognitive profile to enhance other services (e.g., Ed therapy, SLP, OT) • When previous assessments have not led to meaningful gains and there are questions about additional/alternative diagnoses • When school or college testing boards require comprehensive updated testing in order to provide accommodations (certain diagnoses)	Approx. 8-10 hours of in-person testing over 2-4 days	\$4800

Targeted Assessments:

School Readiness Assessment This assessment is for <i>preschool-aged children</i> . It evaluates general development and pre-academic skills to assess for any gaps or limitations that should be addressed prior to entering Kindergarten. (IQ, pre-academics, and behavioral/adaptive/motor development) *Same-day 30-min intake and 60-minute feedback	Approx. 2 hours of in-person testing over 1 day	\$1150
Gifted Assessment (IQ) *Same-day 30-min intake and 30-minute feedback	Approx. 1.5 hours of in-person testing over 1 day	\$800
Targeted ADHD Assessment (Attention, executive functioning/cognitive proficiency, and socioemotional/behavioral functioning across home & school settings) *Same-day 30-min intake and 30-minute feedback	Approx. 1.5 hours of in-person testing over 1 day	\$800
Full ADHD Assessment (IQ, attention, language, visual-spatial processing, executive functioning/cognitive proficiency, and socioemotional/behavioral functioning across home & school settings) Unlike the Targeted ADHD option, this assessment evaluates for differences in additional areas of cognitive functioning that can present outwardly as attention problems (i.e., giftedness, language processing skills, and visual-spatial processing skills).	Approx. 3 hours of in-person testing over 1-2 days	\$1800
Targeted Learning Disorder Assessment: <i>(One of the following)</i> Dyslexia/Reading Disorder Assessment (IQ, language, & reading testing) Dysgraphia/Written Expression Disorder Assessment (IQ, language, writing, & visual-motor skills testing) Dyscalculia/Math Disorder Assessment (IQ, visual-spatial skills, & in-depth mathematics testing)	Approx. 3-4 hours of in-person testing over 1-2 days	\$1950
Autism Assessment (IQ, social cognition, and social language testing, socioemotional/behavioral functioning across home & school settings, as well as a structured clinical Autism interview/activities)	Approx. 4 hours of in-person testing over 1-2 days	\$2300

Additional Services:

Dr. Greenfield provides additional "add-on" services at an hourly rate of \$250/hr.

- **School Behavioral Observation:** Dr. Greenfield will observe your child in their classroom environment. She typically observes children for about 1-hour so that she can assess their behavior across academic and social time, as well as their ability to transition between activities. You are not charged for required travel time within Brevard County.
 - This service may be provided *pro bono* as a part of a comprehensive neuropsychological assessment.
- **IEP Meetings:** Dr. Greenfield is available to attend IEP meetings to discuss the results of the assessment with your IEP team and advocate for the services and accommodations she feels that your child requires to access their curriculum. You are not charged for required travel time within Brevard County.
 - This service may be provided *pro bono* in some cases (based on family request/need).
- **Transitional Therapy Services:** When appropriate, Dr. Greenfield will see select children for short-term therapy following their assessment, with the goal of providing initial care while families find an available specialist who is an good longterm fit.
- **Consultation Services:** Dr. Greenfield is available for one-time or ongoing consultation appointments with parents to discuss concerns, provide parenting support/strategies, update educational/treatment recommendations, or provide her expertise in areas of neurodevelopment, socioemotional development, behavioral concerns, and evidence-based treatment planning.
